

DOWNERS GROVE SANITARY DISTRICT

Description

The Downers Grove Sanitary District is a unit of local government providing wastewater collection and treatment services to most of the Village of Downers Grove, portions of the Villages of Westmont, Oak Brook, Woodridge, Lisle and Lombard, portions of the City of Darien, and adjacent unincorporated areas.

The District is governed by a three-member Board of Trustees appointed by the Chairman of the DuPage County Board. The members of the Board of Trustees are Wallace D. Van Buren, Trustee-President, Amy S. Kovacevic, Trustee-Vice President, and Donald F. Peters, Trustee-Clerk. A Board of Local Improvements reviews requests for sanitary sewer service. This Board of Local Improvements is appointed by the Sanitary District Board of Trustees. The members of the Board of Local Improvements are W. Robert Ivarson, Jr., Kenneth J. Rathje, and Robert T. Jungwirth.

The operating budget of the District for fiscal year 2013-14 is \$7,589,050. The District has 34 full-time employees and 6 part-time employees.

The District's Administration Center is located at 2710 Curtiss Street, Downers Grove, Illinois 60515.

The functional subdivisions of the District include Administration, Wastewater Treatment Laboratory, Wastewater Treatment Operations, Wastewater Treatment Maintenance, Code Enforcement and Collection System.
