MINUTES

The monthly meeting of the Downers Grove Sanitary District Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday, June 18, 2019, convening at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the District's Administration Center, 2710 Curtiss Street, Downers Grove. Present were President Wallace D. Van Buren, Trustee Amy S. Sejnost, and Trustee Paul W. Coultrap, General Manager Nicholas J. Menninga, Administrative Supervisor W. Clay Campbell, Sewer Construction Supervisor Ted Cherwak, Information Coordinator Alyssa J. Caballero and Attorney Michael G. Philipp.

Minutes of Regular Meeting – May 21, 2019

A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost approving the minutes of the regular meeting held on May 21, 2019 as presented and authorizing the President and Clerk to sign same. The motion carried.

Claim Ordinance No. 1878

A motion was made by Trustee Sejnost seconded by Trustee Coultrap adopting Claim Ordinance No. 1878 in the total amount of \$666,521.28 as presented and authorizing the President and Clerk to sign same. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes–Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

Trustee Kovacevic inquired about vehicle sales/purchases discussed at the May meeting.

New Business:

2018 Levy Ordinance

Administrative Supervisor Campbell presented the proposed Levy Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the amount of \$1,282,600 for sanitary sewer repairs and replacements and repayments of loans under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 / Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Water Pollution Control Loan Program. This levy will be reflected in real estate tax bills due in 2020. A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost adopting the Levy Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the amount of \$1,282,600 for sanitary sewer repairs and replacements and repayments of loans under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 / Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Water Pollution Control Loan Program and authorizing the President and Clerk to sign same, adopting the Certificate of Levy and authorizing the Clerk to sign same, and authorizing Assistant Clerk Campbell to sign the Certificate of Inapplicability. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes-Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

Contract Award – Paving Services

General Manager Menninga reviewed the bid opening on June 5 for the 2019 Painting Services project. This project consists of painting services at a few locations at the Wastewater Treatment Center and the floor and entry tube at Wroble Lift Station. Three bids were received. He

recommended that the District award the project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, G.P. Maintenance Services, Inc., in the amount of \$107,500.00. A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost awarding the contract for the 2019 Painting Services project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, G.P. Maintenance Services, Inc., in the amount of \$107,500.00 and authorizing the General Manager and Assistant Clerk to execute the contract documents. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes–Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

Resolution of Appreciation for Employee Service

General Manager Menninga presented a Resolution of Appreciation for Irene Taylor for more than 26 years of dedicated service to the District. A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost to pass the resolution. The motion carried.

Investment in Certificate of Deposit – First Internet Bank

Administrative Supervisor Campbell reviewed staff's purchase on May 14, 2019 of a twelve-month Certificate of Deposit with First Internet Bank in the amount of \$250,000 with an annual interest rate of 2.75 percent. The Certificate of Deposit is secured by the FDIC. A motion by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost was made ratifying the actions of staff on behalf of the District to open a Certificate of Deposit on May 14, 2019 in the amount of \$250,000 with First Internet Bank at an interest rate of 2.75 percent and a term of twelve months. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes–Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

Investment in Certificate of Deposit – Transportation Alliance Bank

Administrative Supervisor Campbell reviewed staff's renewal on May 23, 2019 of a twelve-month Certificate of Deposit with Transportation Alliance Bank in the amount of \$250,000 with an annual interest rate of 2.47 percent. The Certificate of Deposit is secured by the FDIC. A motion was made by Trustee Sejnost seconded by Trustee Coultrap ratifying the actions of staff on behalf of the District to open a Certificate of Deposit on May 23, 2019 in the amount of \$250,000 with Transportation Alliance Bank at an interest rate of 2.47 percent and a term of twelve months. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes–Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

Operations Report – Wastewater Treatment Center Data Management

General Manager Menninga presented a report reviewing the District's data management software applications for operations and asset management at the District's Wastewater Treatment Center. His report included a review of the software which provides data tracking used to evaluate and control operations over the District's wastewater treatment processes, and the software package for managing the District's non-sewer assets.

Other New Business

Trustee Van Buren welcomed Alex Bielawa, District engineer, to the District. He also congratulated Irene Taylor on her retirement after 26 years with the District. He inquired about the automobile crash at Wroble Lift Station noted in Maintenance Supervisor Barta's report. Trustee Van Buren commended laboratory staff for their hard work during the recent excess flow events and congratulated Alan Hartigan for 10 years of service to the District. Lastly, he commented on the TPO magazine article and commended General Manager Menninga for his work with PBS NewsHour on their segment featuring the District's net-zero operations.

Trustee Coultrap congratulated Irene Taylor on her retirement after 26 years with the District and welcomed Alex Bielawa, District engineer, to the District. He commended General Manager Menninga for his work with PBS NewsHour on their segment featuring the District's net-zero operations. Trustee Coultrap also commended staff for their hard work during the recent excess flow events and congratulated Alan Hartigan for 10 years of service to the District. Lastly, he inquired about the District's safety committee.

Trustee Sejnost welcomed Alex Bielawa, District engineer, to the District. He also congratulated Irene Taylor on her retirement after 26 years with the District. She commented on the one excursion that occurred in May and the WWTC's net energy usage during May, both noted in Operations Supervisor Majewski's report. A motion was made by Trustee Sejnost seconded by Trustee Coultrap to recess the regular meeting and convene an executive session at 7:47 p.m. under exception 2(c)1 of the Open Meetings Act to discuss personnel matters. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes-Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost to reconvene the regular meeting at 8:16 p.m. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes- Van Buren, Sejnost and Coultrap.)

The Trustees and General Manager Menninga discussed timing, potential salary and benefits associated with an Assistant General Manager position at the District.

A motion was made by Trustee Coultrap seconded by Trustee Sejnost to adjourn the regular meeting at 8:40 p.m. The motion carried.

SUBJECT: Contract Award, 2019 Sewer Cleaning and Televising

This year we budgeted \$100,000 to conduct contract televising of sewers to improve our sewer condition assessment database. Incidental sewer cleaning is needed in order to produce the needed video footage.

We prepared detailed specifications and identified the locations of this year's work.

The project was advertised for bidding as required. We received five bids, which were opened on July 9, 2019. The results of the bids are included in the attached bid tabulation. Our estimate of probable cost was \$100,000.

We have reviewed the bids and recommend award to Pipe-View LLC of LaPorte, Indiana, as the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, with a total bid price of \$120,766.25.

We have worked successfully with this contractor on a similar project, and have confidence in their ability to complete the project.

Staff will be seeking approval from the Board of Trustees to award the 2019 Sewer Cleaning and Televising contract to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Pipe-View LLC of LaPorte, Indiana, and for the General Manager and Assistant Clerk to sign the same.

In accordance with the District Investment Policy, we purchased an eleven-month Certificate of Deposit (CD) with the local Downers Grove BMO Harris Bank on June 17, 2019. The CD is in the amount of \$250,000 at an interest rate of 2.469%. This bank was selected based on a review of competitive rates from financial institutions that accept public funds. The CD is FDIC insured to \$250,000.

This CD was purchased with Fund 01 funds for the term of eleven months to allow staff to continue laddering District investments. Staff would request for the Board to take action ratifying this investment at its next regular meeting of July 16, 2019 **using the following motion:** "I move that we ratify the actions of staff on behalf of the District to open a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$250,000 with BMO Harris Bank on June 17, 2019 at an interest rate of 2.469% and a term of eleven months."

The meeting was held at the District's Administration Center, 2710 Curtiss Street, Downers Grove. Present were Board Members Kenneth J. Rathje, Robert T. Jungwirth and Mark J. Scacco, Administrative Supervisor W. Clay Campbell, Sewer Construction Supervisor Ted Cherwak, Sewer Inspector Keith W. Shaffner, Information Coordinator Alyssa J. Caballero, Trustees Wallace D. Van Buren and Paul W. Coultrap. President Rathje called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m.

Minutes of March 19, 2019 Meeting

A motion was made by Jungwirth seconded by Scacco approving the minutes of the meeting held on March 19, 2019. The motion carried.

Public Comment – None

P697 – 4110 Finley Road, Downers Grove

Board member Jungwirth recused himself from discussion and voting on this item as Spaceco is a sister company to his full-time employer. The Board reviewed a request for sanitary sewer service from Mark Houser of Bridge Development Partners, LLC, contract purchaser/developer, for 133,443 square foot office-warehouse building on a 12.21 gross acre parcel at 4110 Finley Road, Downers Grove. The property is within the District's Facilities Planning Area, but is not within the District's current corporate limits. The proposed use will generate an estimated wastewater flow of 2,936 gallons per day or a density of 2.41 PE per acre, which is within the District's design allocation of 25 PE per acres. The flow estimate is based 15% of the building use in office space and 85% in warehouse space. The flow factors are 0.09 gallon per day per square foot of office space and 0.01 gallon per day per square foot of warehouse space. Service can be provided to this project by extension of the public sewer main from the existing District sewer located on the Morton Arboretum and University of Illinois properties. The proposed sewer design will require the granting of a sewer easements to the District (from the University of Illinois and Nicor). The downstream trunk sewers have adequate reserve capacity to serve this request. Staff recommended approval of this request. A motion was made by Scacco seconded by Rathje approving this request subject to annexation, to a maximum flow of 2.04 gallons per minute (2,936 gallons per day), receipt of an Illinois EPA permit, construction of public sewer main extension, the granting of the sewer easements, payment of all fees per ordinance, compliance with all District ordinances, and standard conditions. The motion carried. (Votes recorded: Ayes–Rathje and Scacco. Abstain–Jungwirth.)

Upon a motion by Jungwirth seconded by Scacco, the meeting was adjourned at 6:54 p.m. The motion carried.

REQUEST:

Drew Mitchell of Holladay Properties, developer, is requesting sanitary sewer service for a 5 Story, 94 Unit mixed use building on a 1.29 gross acre parcel at the above location. The property is within the District's Facilities Planning Area (FPA), and within the District's current corporate limits. The existing commercial and residential buildings on this property will be disconnected from the Sanitary District main and demolished. The proposed use of 1 W. Quincy will generate an estimated wastewater flow of 19,400 gallons per day or a density of 149.23 PE per acre. The District's design allocation for this site is 25 PE per acre. The flow estimate is based on 76 one bedroom residential units, 18 two bedroom units and a 3,400 square foot restaurant. The flow factors are 150 gallons per day for one bedroom units and 300 gallons per day for two bedroom units. The 3,400 square foot 65 seat restaurant flow estimate is based on a flow factor of 40 gallons per day per seat.

SUMMARY:

Service can be provided to this property by connection to the Sanitary District sewer located in the alley to the West of the project. A portion of the public alley will be vacated by the Village of Westmont and the sanitary sewer main in that portion will be removed due to the larger scale of the proposed building. The portion of the sanitary main that will be removed has no upstream flow and no other private service connection. The downstream trunk sewers have adequate reserve capacity to serve this request (see attached memo from Baxter & Woodman). Staff recommends approval of this request to a maximum flow of 13.47 gallons per minute (19,400 gallons per day), and subject to receipt of an Illinois EPA permit, payment of all fees per ordinance, and compliance with all District ordinances and standard conditions.

The District has been approached by a developer to replace the existing apartment building and commercial building at the properties of 20 S. Cass Avenue, 14 S. Cass Avenue, and 33 W. Quincy Street (all in Westmont, IL) with a proposed five-story mixed use building. This would increase the wastewater loading from 17 population equivalents (P.E.) to 194 P.E. and would generate an additional 17,700 gallons per day (gpd) to be connected upstream of manhole 1N-051. This equates to an additional average daily flow of 12 gallons per minute (gpm) and a peak flow of 53 gpm. The purpose of this evaluation is to determine whether sufficient downstream capacity is available to serve the subject property.

The flow metering locations downstream of the proposed development are shown in the table below. A lower rank number indicates higher risk of I/I (i.e. A basin with the rank of 1 has the worst I/I performance out of all 150 basins.) In general, the downstream basins perform well, but note that Basins 1N-011 and 1G-005 are ranked in the worst 25 percentile.

In 2010, a hydraulic model was prepared in XP-SWMM to evaluate the existing capacity and impact of additional flow to the collection system serving the Westmont Downtown area. This included all Group A Basins in the District's flow metering program. Typically, the District evaluates sanitary sewers for the capability to handle a ten-year frequency storm event.

The 2010 model was revised to include the cumulative wastewater loadings from previously reviewed developments, including the following:

-) 408-420 N. Cass Avenue, 77 P.E. (tributary to 1G-005 in this study)

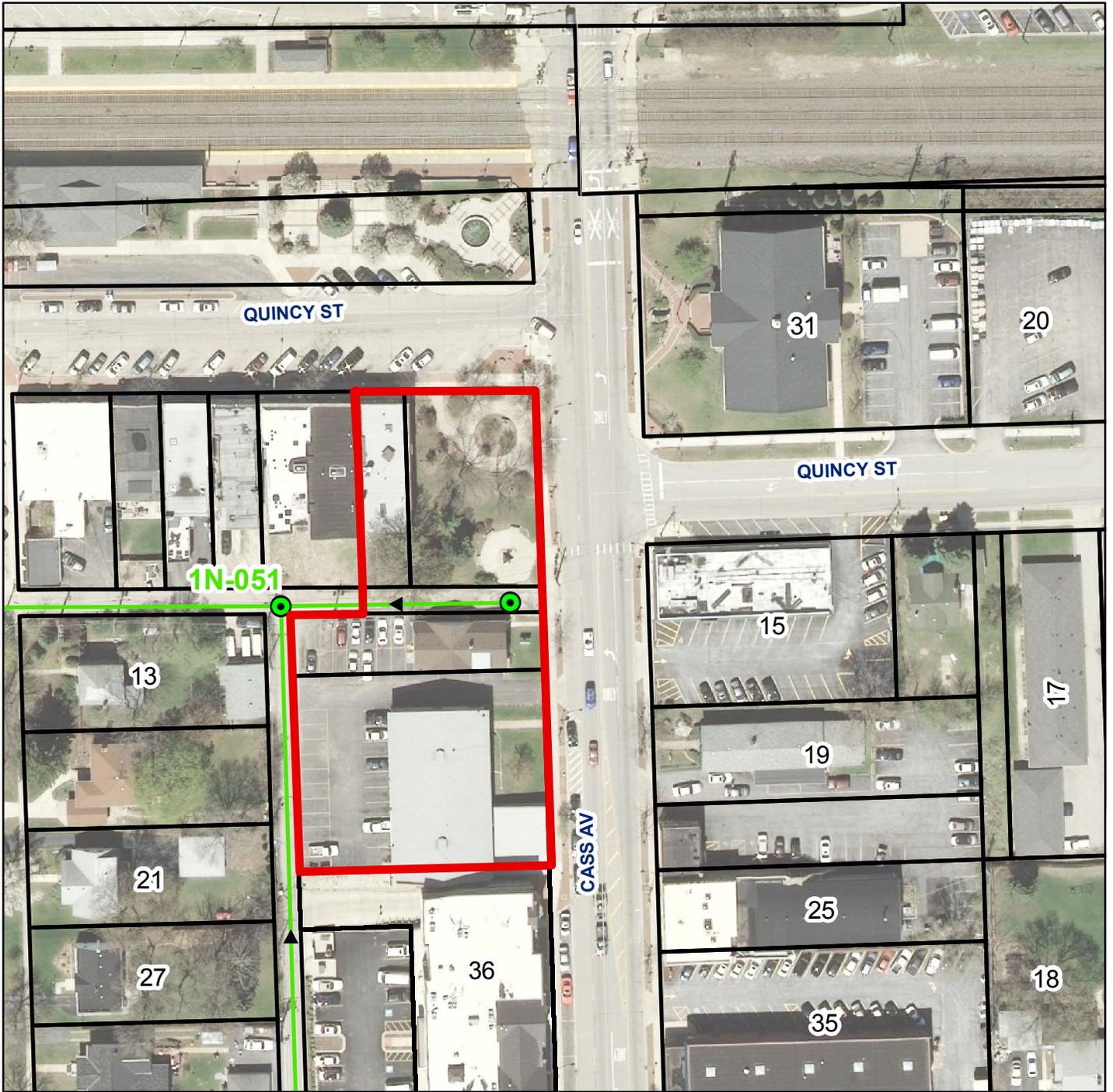
The 2010 model was revised to include improvements to the collections system, including the following:

-) Basin 1G-046 - ARRA Grouting
-) Basin 1K-002 - ARRA Grouting
-) Basin 1K-028 - Alley Sewer Replacement, Phase 1 and Phase 2

The model simulations show the collection system has available capacity to receive the proposed flow addition without causing sanitary sewer overflows. The simulations predict minimal surcharging. However, sensitivity analyses show the level of surcharging can be volatile for additional future flows. The model predicts Manhole 1G-014 as the first manhole downstream that would overflow. Manhole 1G-014 is 6.75 feet deep and has 4.75 feet of freeboard.

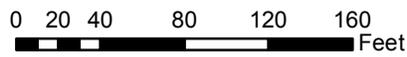
Our evaluation determined the addition of the development will not significantly impact the hydraulic grade line (hgl) in the trunk sewer during peak flow events. Thus, the additional flow from the proposed development will have a negligible impact on the sewer system operation. However, we recommend the District continue with improvements (1K-028 Basin Sewer Replacement) in the collection system upstream of Manhole 1G-014 to increase protection against surcharging. In addition, we recommend further analysis of the area to evaluate reserve capacity, potential future flows, and required I/I reduction to accommodate future development.

ADMINISTRATIVE

Personnel

Susan Allgood, part-time secretary for the District, provided me with a two-weeks' notice of her resignation. Her last day with the District was July 5. The District is currently advertising for that position and hopes to have it filled in the next month.

Summer Employee Function

We will be having an employee function for employees and their guests at Morton Arboretum in the coming month or so.

Reimbursement Program for Sanitary Sewer
Backups Caused by Public Sanitary Sewer Blockages

On July 9, the District was the jetting sanitary sewer main on Park Street in Westmont and the toilet at 144 N. Park Street, Westmont was blown with a small report of damage. The property owner was immediately provided a BURP packet. As a result, I am providing you with a program summary this month.

Safety Committee

Jessie Gwozdz, previously the District's Part-Time Document Scanner (a temporary position), accepted the District's offered position of Part-Time Administrative Assistant / Safety Coordinator (a permanent position) and started in that capacity on June 17. Over the next month or two (as she is wrapping up the BSSRAP scanning project), I will be bringing Jessie up to speed on the safety needs of the District and how her new role will fit.

Local Records Disposal

The District performed its annual local records disposal process filing a request with the Illinois Secretary of State's Local Records Division office. Administration staff identified appropriate

records that could be purged either because they have been digitized, were outside their retention period or staff determined there was no compelling business purpose for keeping the records.

Social Media/Public Outreach Progress

Both the District’s Painting Services Contract bidding process and Televising Services Contract bidding process were facilitated through the District’s website and/or its partner site, QuestCDN. We also utilized the site for posting bid results in a clean, easily readable format (historically we would offer to fax the handwritten bid tab or one prepared with Microsoft Excel to a requestor). This provides a self-service option.

Technology Update

Jessie Gwozdz’s work digitizing the District’s BSSRAP files is almost complete – there are a few last minute punchlist items we are resolving before we go live.

We are working on several different projects for the next several months with Concentric Integration:

- We are still testing the Mobile-911 alarming software.
- Pricing out potential replacement of the District’s network-allocated storage devices and drives used for data backups (the units are in great shape, but they were deployed in 2011 and we should consider alternatives for the next budget year).
- Final resolution of the alarming node replacements (final hardware migration of Dialogix dialer cards) – this is still being resolved.
- IT Planning Session with Concentric Integration on July 24 regarding future SCADA Infrastructure for the District.

As well, staff also met with Howard Curtis and Ken Lenard of Curtis Martin Group, Inc. (the District’s accounting server programmers) to discuss a few fixes and mostly feature implementations planned for the next several months to increase efficiency among Administration staff.

Attached please find detailed operating data and our monthly report to Illinois EPA for June. We had no excursions over our permit limits in June.

Certain highlights of operational activities included:

- Monthly flow: Average daily flows to the plant were 12.65 MGD. Total precipitation at the WWTC was 4.89". There were no days of excess flow during the month of June. There were 22 days of discharge over 11 mgd.
- Activated sludge: Good operating performance continued throughout the month of June. Periodic dosing of hypochlorite to RAS has helped filamentous control, leading to good settling solids.
- Anaerobic Digesters: Pumped a total of 1,089,537 gallons of primary sludge, 915,090 gallons of WAS, and 268,166 gallons of waste grease for a total of 2,272,793 gallons pumped to digesters. Total Volatile Solids destruction was calculated at 50.5% for June.
- Digester gas: Total digester gas production was 7,962,295 cubic feet. 21,339 cubic feet of gas was used for anaerobic digestion heat, and 6,736,562 cubic feet was used in the CHP facilities. 528,314 cubic feet of flared gas was recorded during the month. The Munters dehumidifier used 676,081 cubic feet of gas.
- Bio-solids: Bio solid drying has been very slow due to the frequent rain events. 271 cubic yards were delivered in the month of June. Total for the year is 726 cubic yards.
- Miscellaneous Items: Oscar Avila began June 17th as seasonal building and groundskeeper. Operations took delivery June 28th of a Yamaha golf cart. This replaces one of the older Club Car golf carts.
- Electricity: Overall net energy from ComEd was: -68,508 KW-Hrs. Electricity Generated by the CHP system was 442,389 KW-Hrs. Monthly net energy (including natural gas usage) was -67 MW-Hrs for the month of June.

Attached is a work order summary detailing equipment repair and preventive maintenance activities conducted by the maintenance/electrical department and operations during June 2019.

Special projects in June included:

Underground Power Feed Replacement – Excess Flow 003 Discharge Sluice Gates

Some of the 480 volt power wiring in the underground conduit between the manhole 2 structure (by the grease receiving tank), and the 003 discharge sluice gates at intermediate clarifier 3 had shorted out. Since the conductors were stuck in the conduit and couldn't be removed, we found a way to temporarily power the sluice gates so they were completely operational until the conduit and wiring could be replaced.

Since this conduit runs under the roadway that is scheduled to be repaved this summer, we needed to get the permanent repair completed in advance of the paving work. Uno Construction excavated between the two locations to expose the damaged conduit. District electrical and maintenance staff replaced the damaged conduit, installed new power and control wiring, terminated all connections and verified proper operation of all three sluice gates after all of the terminations were complete. After all of the electrical work was completed, District staff backfilled and compacted the trench in the roadway area and completed the site restoration in the trench areas.

Wroble Lift Station Update – Site & Equipment Damage from Automobile Crash

Unfortunately there hasn't been much progress besides removal of the damaged sign and landscaping. We have received quotes to replace the sign, fencing repairs and gate replacement. The proposal for a new sign from Signs Now in Downers Grove is \$3,859.00. The fence repairs and gate replacement proposal from Discount Fence in Downers Grove is \$2,100.00.

We are still waiting on the completion of the engineering work and the cost proposals from ComEd for the transformer and the automatic throw over (ATO) transfer switch replacement. I am anticipating receiving their proposal later this week.

We have submitted the repair quotes to the driver's insurance company (State Farm Insurance) for the sign replacement, fencing repairs and the gate replacement. State Farm is requesting that all of the repair/replacement quotes be submitted before they will approve issuance of a payment - at which point we can move forward with the repairs. Once we get the proposal from ComEd, we will be able to proceed. I will provide another update in next month's report.

We had 0 excess rain sampling events June. There were 0 permit excursions during May 2019.

Industrial/Pretreatment:

All sampling required by DGSD and permitted industrial users has been completed for the monitoring period January-June. We are working with Rexnord at their new facility to get each point sampled, before they combine sampling locations entering the sanitary sewer. They have some really low volume equipment, which makes it difficult to obtain a representative sample. They have decided to take certain pieces of equipment off-line and container the waste and have it hauled away vs releasing it to the sanitary sewer.

Flavorchem reported a spill of a white concentrated liquid, which we did observe in our primary tanks. It was a small volume (~15 gallons), so it didn't impact our process or our final effluent leaving the plant. We are working with them to ensure proper training is being performed and followed by their staff. We requested an updated SPCC (Spill Prevention Control Countermeasure) Plan for their facility. I'm also planning a facility walk through with our contact at Flavorchem.

LoveJoy reported an oil spill in their loading dock. They contacted many agencies when it initially took place, but after some research into their facility and investigating the sewer system, we determined their loading dock area is a closed system. We required them to pump the area down and dispose of the waste from that system with a licensed hauler. We are waiting for a copy of the manifest and to get approval for televising the area.

Biosolids:

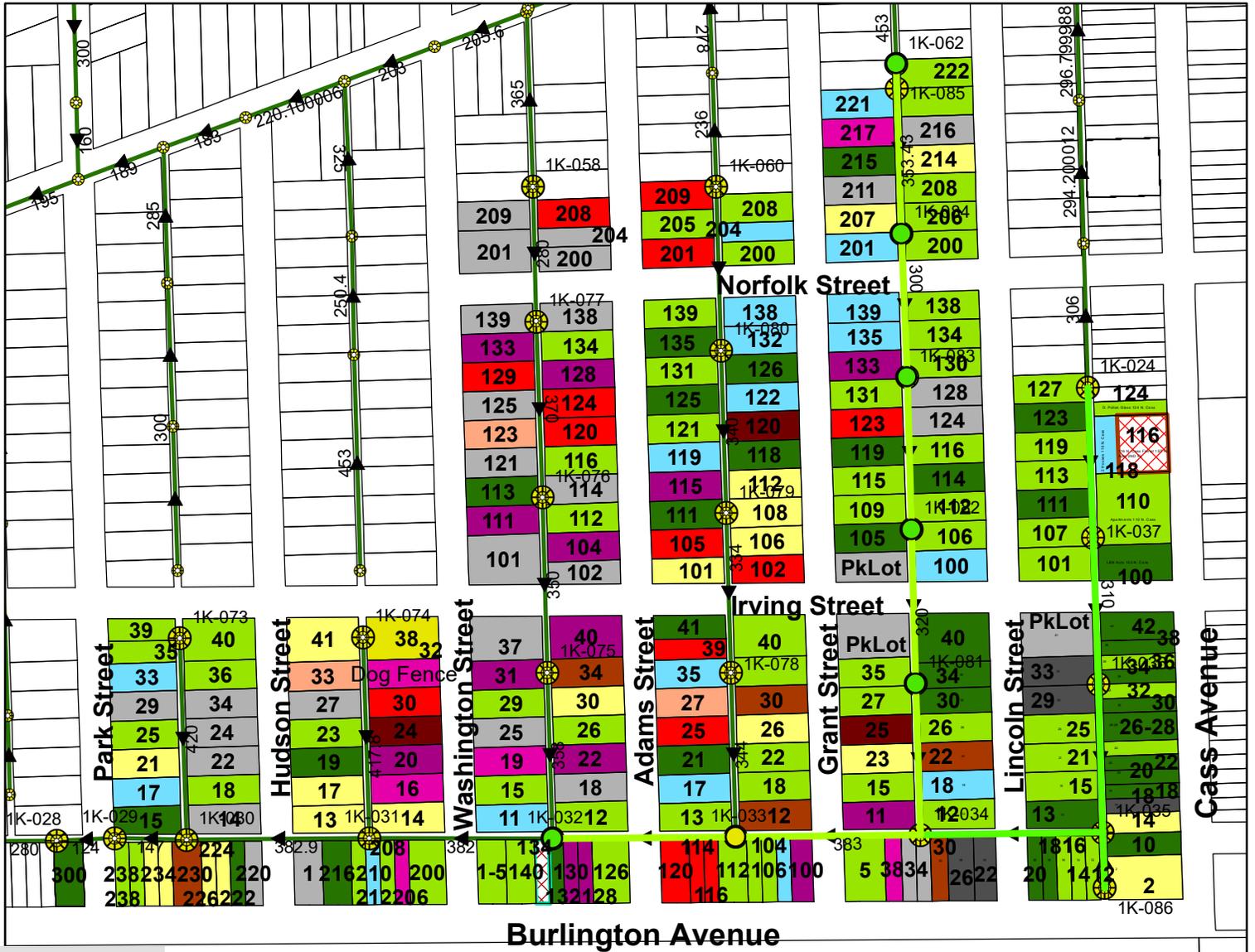
All data from the May sampling period was acceptable and well below the concentration thresholds for Class A biosolids.

Surcharge:

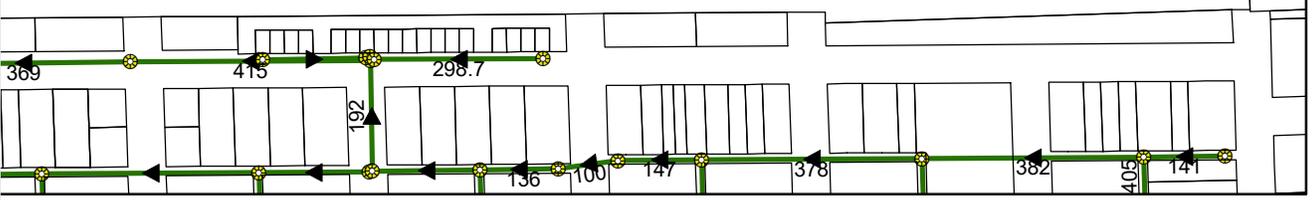

WWTC Operations Data – May

The DMR for May indicates that the final effluent averaged 1.50 mg/l CBOD, 2.00 mg/l suspended solids and 0.38 mg/l ammonia nitrogen over a daily average flow of 18.06 MGD. There was 1 permit excursion for TSS at outfall 003 due to the heavy storm event on May 1.

Sewer Permits – May

There were 26 sewer permits issued in May – 19 single family, 3 commercial, and 4 disconnections.

Financial Data – May

In May, the District received \$668,063 in the General fund, including \$236,511 in user charges, \$30,730 in surcharges, and \$306,767 in monthly fees. General fund expenses totaled \$853,872. The Improvement fund had revenues of \$13,574 and expenses of \$2,868. The Construction fund had revenues of \$45,110 and expenses of \$0.

Status of Projects

1) Westmont Alley Sewer Replacement

The project consists of alley sewer replacement work in the 1-K-028 drainage area, in the vicinity of Lincoln St and Grant St between Naperville Rd and Burlington Ave. Uno Construction is developing a plan to correct sagged sections of new pipe that did not pass post-construction testing requirements.

2) 001 Outfall Pipe Repair

Baxter & Woodman has completed survey and geotechnical work, and is completing the design of the repairs needed for the sagged section of the outfall pipe that carries effluent flow to the East Branch of the DuPage River. Construction permit applications for the County and the State are in process.

3) WWTC WAS Mechanical Thickening

Baxter & Woodman is nearing completion of design of the installation of a mechanical sludge thickener to be located in the digester 4-5 control building.

4) 2019-20 Sewer Rehabilitation

The Warren Avenue Lining Contract is now fully signed with Insituform. The pre-construction meeting is scheduled for June 25, 2019. It is anticipated that this project will commence shortly thereafter.

5) MPI Paving Contract

The 2019 Paving Contract is now fully signed with Schroeder Asphalt Services. We will be scheduling the pre-construction visit shortly.

6) 2019 Painting Services

The Board of Trustees approved award of the 2019 painting contract to GP Maintenance Services Inc. of Palos Hills, Illinois, in the amount of \$107,500. Contract paperwork is in process.

Illinois Distracted Driving Law Passed

Employees should note that effective July 1, 2019, Illinois has amended the Illinois Vehicle Code to make use of an "electronic communications device" while driving (otherwise known as "Distracted Driving") now a moving violation. This is not limited to texting on smartphones and could include any touching or manipulation of smartphones, tablets, or laptop devices while driving. There continues to be certain exceptions to the law such as (just a few of the more common examples): (1) use by law enforcement personnel; (2) a driver using an electronic communication device for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued communication with emergency personnel during the emergency situation; (3) utilizing any of these devices in "hands-free" or "voice-free" mode; (4) a driver using an electronic communication device while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; and (5) a driver using an electronic communication device by pressing a single button to initiate or terminate a voice communication. A driver that receives three moving violations in a twelve month period could have their license suspended.
